The term "voluntary" is used to denote a piece of music or improvisation for instrument, played before, during, or at the end of a church service.

Eastertide, or the **Easter Season**, begins on Easter Sunday and continues until **Pentecost** in the Christian liturgical calendar for a total span of seven weeks. We celebrate Easter more than just Easter Sunday because it is the defining event of Christianity, and so the Church has always observed it for longer than the Day itself. The liturgical color is white or gold, the Pascal candle is kept lit and the worship services end with a special "Alleluia." Scripture lessons during this season are from the New Testament only (except for Easter Sunday), saying what happened after the Resurrection. The Thursday in the sixth week of Easter marks **Ascension Day**, as Jesus was taken up into heaven.



WHAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

† On May 4, 1493, the Spanish Pope Alexander VI issued the Inter caeterea II, which divided the known world between Spain and Portugal along a longitudinal line running 250 miles west of the Cape Verde Islands. Preturning from the Diet of Worms, Martin Luther was "kidnapped" for his own protection on May 4, 1521, by the German ruler Frederick the Wise and kept at Wartburg where he translated the Bible into German. * Gulielma Springett was born in London in 1644 and joined the Quaker movement at age 15. On May 4, 1672, she married William Penn and lived on an English estate where the couple assembled with their servants each day for worship and Bible reading. William later fled to America to escape persecution, but his wife died in England. Her last words were: "Let us all prepare, not knowing what hour or watch the Lord cometh.... I have cast my care upon the Lord." Φ On May 4. 1737, evangelist George Whitefield penned a note to Gabriel Harris, describing the response to his open air preaching in areas around Gloucester: "People flock to hear the word of God from the neighboring villages as well as our own. They gladly receive me into their houses and I have not a hindrance to my ministerial business." \$\phi\$ May 4, 1784, marks the birth of Carl G. Glaser, German music teacher and writer of the tune for Charles Wesley's "O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing" (our middle hymn today).
