The term "voluntary" is used to denote a piece of music or improvisation for instrument, played before, during, or at the end of a church service.

Eastertide, or the **Easter Season**, begins on Easter Sunday and continues until **Pentecost** in the Christian liturgical calendar for a total span of seven weeks. We celebrate Easter more than just Easter Sunday because it is the defining event of Christianity, and so the Church has always observed it for longer than the Day itself. The liturgical color is white or gold, the Pascal candle is kept lit and the worship services end with a special "Alleluia." Scripture lessons during this season are from the New Testament only (except for Easter Sunday), saying what happened after the Resurrection. The Thursday in the sixth week of Easter marks **Ascension Day**, as Jesus was taken up into heaven.

WHAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

* On May 18, 1291, the city of Acre fell to invading Moslem armies, signaling the end of a Christian "military presence" in the Middle East during the Crusades. + On May 18, 1593, the Protestant Henry Bourbon of Navarre converted to Catholicism to become France's King Henry IV. Five years later, he issued the Edict of Nantes, granting Huguenots (French Protestants) religious freedom. • Frontier evangelist. **Sheldon Jackson**, was born on May 18. 1834. He stood just over five feet tall, but his size, he said, allowed him to sleep anywhere. His bed was a stagecoach floor, a saloon loft, a hollow log, a teepee, a canoe. During 50 years of ministry, he traveled a million miles through the West and North. He oversaw the establishing provided by his New York church, Rev. Maltie D. Babcock, 43, suddenly died of "Mediterranean fever." He is best remembered as the author of the hymn "This Is My Father's World." • Karol Wojtyla — Pope John Paul II — was born on May 18,1920. He became the Archbishop of Krakow in 1963, and on October 16, 1978, became the first non-Italian pope since Hadrian VI in the sixteenth century. • On May 18, 1926, popular evangelist Aimee Semple McPherson mysteriously vanished while visiting a beach in Venice, CA. She reappeared a month later, claiming to have been kidnapped. Her story was widely disbelieved.
