The term "voluntary" is used to denote a piece of music or improvisation for instrument, played before, during, or at the end of a church service.

The Season after Pentecost, also called Ordinary Time, begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent. It may include twenty-three to twenty-eight Sundays, depending on the date of Easter, but the first Sunday is always Trinity Sunday, and the last Sunday is always the Sunday of the Reign of Christ or Christ the King. Although the scripture lessons in the lectionary for this half of the year go in a semi-continuous cycle through books of the Bible rather than follow a theme, the gospel lessons cover Jesus' teaching ministry and the church's mission in the world. The liturgical color for this season is GREEN, signifying growth in Christ, except on Communion Sundays when it is white.

WHAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

The Second Nicea Council, convoked by the Empress Irene to end the Iconoclastic Controversy, met on this day in the church of the Holy Apostles at Constantinople, but was immediately broken up by iconoclastic soldiers. * Pope Julius II, who laid the cornerstone of St. Peter's Basilica, was seized by violent illness on this day in 1511. For three days he hovered near death, but as his successor was about to be chosen, he surprised (and disappointed) his cardinals by recovering. • On August 17, 1635, Richard Mather arrived in Boston, An English Puritan and staunch defender of congregational church government, he is remembered as the father of Increase Mather and the grandfather of Cotton Mather. * When the British monarchy was reinstated in 1660, a series of new laws stifled religious liberty. The Act of Uniformity, for example, required ministers to use The Book of Common Prayer as a format for worship. Many non-Anglicans refused, and in August 17, 1662, over 2,000 of England's finest ministers preached their "farewell sermons" and were ejected from their pulpits. * August 17, 1761, is the birthday of William Carey, "Father of Modern Missions." * August 17, 1780, is the birthday of George Croly, author of "Spirit of God, Descend Upon My Heart." + On August 17, 1809, Thomas Campbell founded the Disciples of Christ Church. P Radio Bible teacher Theodore Epp was converted on this day in 1927 after listening to a sermon from Ephesians 1.
