The term "voluntary" is used to denote a piece of music or improvisation for instrument, played before, during, or at the end of a church service.

The Season after Pentecost, also called Ordinary Time, begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent. It may include twenty-three to twenty-eight Sundays, depending on the date of Easter, but the first Sunday is always Trinity Sunday, and the last Sunday is always the Sunday of the Reign of Christ or Christ the King. Although the scripture lessons in the lectionary for this half of the year go in a semi-continuous cycle through books of the Bible rather than follow a theme, the gospel lessons cover Jesus' teaching ministry and the church's mission in the world. The liturgical color for this season is GREEN, signifying growth in Christ, except on Communion Sundays when it is white.


# **SERMON NOTES**



# WHAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

† On August 31, 1688, **John Bunyan**, author of *Pilgrim's Progress*, died. On his deathbed, battling high fever, Bunyan rambled in tortured, fractured words; but even these were collected and published as Mr. Bunyan's Dying Sayings. + August 31, 1820, marks the birth of **Anna Bartlett Warner**, author of the children's hymn, "Jesus Loves Me." \* Missionary Sarah Judson, second wife of missionary Adoniram **Judson**, was a devout Christian, a hymnist, and the mother of eleven children. She and Adoniram (whose first wife, Ann, had died in 1826) were married in 1834. She went to work translating Christian works into the Burmese language. Suffering from exhaustion, she and Adoniram left for America in June, 1845. Sarah died en route on August 31, 1845. August 31, 1861, is the birthday of Jesse Brown Pounds, author of the hymns. "Anywhere with Jesus." "I Know that My Redeemer Liveth." and "The Way of the Cross Leads Home." \* Evangelist J. H. Sullivan was holding a revival service at Pine Log Methodist Church in Pine Log, Georgia, but the response to the meetings was disappointing. During the last service, Sunday night, August 31, 1886, Sullivan prayed, "Lord, If it takes it to move the hearts of these people, shake the ground on which this old building stands!" Almost immediately, the building shook perceptibly. Many of those present rushed to the altar to pray for repentance. This became known as the "Earthquake Revival." It was later learned that the tremors they had felt were marginal shock waves from the great earthquake which demolished much of Charleston and the coastal area of South Carolina. • On August 31, 1937, missionary Isabel Kuhn set sail for China.
