WHAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

P December 14, 872, marks the death of the Italian pope, Adrian II, the last married pope, who died at about age 80. P December 14, 1836 is the birthday of hymn writer Frances Ridley Havergal, born in the rectory at Astley, Worcestershire, England. Her father, William Havergal, was an Anglican clergyman who devoted himself to improving the church music in England and had written over 100 hymns himself. Frances struggled throughout her twenties and thirties, pulled in one direction by the acclaim of great London crowds who loved her singing, and in another direction by the Holy Spirit. Then one day at age 36 she read a booklet entitled "All For Jesus," which stressed the importance of making Christ King of every corner and cubicle of one's life. Frances made a fresh, complete consecration to God. Today she is best known as the author of such hymns as "Like a River Glorious" and "Take My Life and Let It Be." * On December 14, 1853, through the efforts of zealous Wesleyans, the Illinois Institute opened its doors for the first time. Seven years later, amid financial struggles, the trustees requested help from the wealthier Congregationalists. **Jonathan Blanchard**, Presbyterian pastor and academic, was appointed president. He approached Warren Wheaton for a large donation of property and offered to name the school Wheaton College. "That will at least save your heirs the expense of a good monument," Blanchard said. Wheaton College has been training students ever since, "For Christ and His Kingdom."
