







### **Extended Family Database**



## A Word from Pastor Chris ....



All,

Happy May! I hope this finds you well. If it doesn't and I can stand with you in any way, please let me know.

In case you missed it, Monday, April 22 was Earth Day. I knew this well in advance. It is listed as such on my planning calendar. It is also listed on my virtual calendars. Yes, this may mean I have too many calendars!

Even though I knew Earth Day's date, I almost missed it. It is not a day I normally plan for or around. When my kids were little, I did, largely because they were part of Earth Day activities at school and I wanted to participate with them. With all having graduated public school, I no longer have advanced warning.

As Earth Day hit, my social media was full of people doing cool Earth Day things, those things I once did with my kids. I found myself a bit nostalgic. I found myself also a bit torn. In my neighborhood, Tuesdays are garbage day. Thus, as Earth Day came to a close, I was wheeling out trash, not recycling. Two days later, I would be wheeling out my recycling; the next day, my trash again. It struck me that we collect trash twice as often as recycling, at least in Merritt Island.

What will come of this, I do not know. What I do know is that I am now evaluating other things too and how aligned they are with my sense of who I am and want to be. This is not always easy work, but it is Kingdom work. I believe I will be better for it at the end. If you're feeling so led, I invite you to join me in the Journey!

On May 19 the Pentecost Special Offering will be collected and is used to support young people in Christ.

- 25% supports youth and children at risk ministries,
- 25% goes to young adult volunteers who are trained to work in mission in the U.S. and around the world
- 10% is used for child advocacy (working to better the lives of children by ensuring equitable, quality public education)

The remaining 40% remains with us and will be sent to a local ministry—Called Out. This ministry educates others about human trafficking. Many victims of this horrendous crime were taken as young teenagers and need our help to make a new and healthier life.

Servant Partners-Riversider's cleaned out closets to send winter coats to Philadelphia to be distributed to people in need. The Missions Commissions has also opted to continue to support Harry and Betty Peterson's granddaughter, Denise Anderson, who lives in a north Philly neighborhood and reaches out to those who live around them with Christ's love, working to literally clean up their neighborhood, as well as developing local leadership to build positive community relationships. She also helps her neighbors with resources to meet their needs. We also chose to support the welding program (ReIGNITE Philly) that gives training that will lead participants to a job and better income.



**Teen Missions International**—For a number of years Riverside has supported a Sunday school in Indonesia.

Like circuit riders of old, graduates of one of Teen Missions Bible schools in Indonesia make a weekly visit at the Riverside Sunday School in Borneo in this largely Muslim nation. Instead of horses, they use motorcycles for transport and share God's love with children.



Madagascar Mission Network (MMN) is affiliated with the Presbyterian Church (USA) and partners with The Church of Jesus Christ (FJKM) who work to share the Gospel, to promote economic opportunities and provide primary and secondary education so that all may experience life in abundance. They support community health programs, water and sanitation initiatives, and agricultural training for pastors and communities and pro-

grams that serve marginalized communities.
