The term "voluntary" is used to denote a piece of music or improvisation for instrument, played before, during, or at the end of a church service.

The Season after Pentecost, also called Ordinary Time, begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent. It may include twenty-three to twentyeight Sundays, depending on the date of Easter, but the first Sunday is always Trinity Sunday, and the last Sunday is always the Sunday of the Reign of Christ or Christ the King. Although the scripture lessons in the lectionary for this half of the year go in a semicontinuous cycle through books of the Bible rather than follow a theme, the gospel lessons cover Jesus' teaching ministry and the church's mission in the world. The liturgical color for this season is GREEN, signifying growth in Christ, except on Communion Sundays when it is white.





WHAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

♦ The Visigoths sacked Rome, disillusioning Christians who were trusting in God's protection of this ecclesiastical center of early Christianity on August 24, 410. St. **Augustine** (354-430) later tacked this religious problem in his monumental work, "City of God" (ca.413-27). * Menas, patriarch of Constantinople, died on this day in 552. He had been actively engaged in the issues of his day as an opponent of monophysitism and of Origen's teachings, but was largely subservient to the Roman pope. † In Mainz, Germany, volume two of the famed **Gutenberg Bible** was bound on August 24, 1456, completing a two-year publishing project, and making it the first full-length book to be printed using movable type. † On this day in 1572, the St. Bartholomew's Day Massacre took place all across France, where thousands of French Protestants (Huguenots) were slaughtered, depleted the intellectual, educational, and financial reserves of the French nation, * William Wilberforce. English philanthropist, was born on August 24, 1759 in Yorkshire, England. He became a Christian in early life and entered politics in 1790. Wilberforce, John Newton, and Thomas Clarkson brilliantly undermined the arguments for slavery and, as a result, complete abolition of slavery came just before his death in 1833. Wilberforce was also instrumental in the founding of the Church Missionary Society in 1799 as well as the British and Foreign Bible Society in 1804. Wilberforce College in Ohio (founded in 1856), the second oldest institution for black higher education in the U.S., was named after him.
