The term "voluntary" is used to denote a piece of music or improvisation for instrument, played before, during, or at the end of a church service.

Trinity Sunday is the First Sunday after Pentecost on the Christian liturgical calendar. Trinity Sunday celebrates the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, the three persons of God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday in the second period of Ordinary Time, or the Time after Pentecost, a period which continues until Advent and is characterized by the use of green as the predominant liturgical color; however, as this is a feast which takes precedence over the occurring Sunday, white is used instead.

GRIEF MATTERS

The sudden or expected loss of a beloved pastor is a deeply felt experience — not only personally, but communally, as a spiritual leader's presence often shapes the identity, rhythm, and vision of the congregation. On the anniversary of Pastor Chris Carson's passing, and to help the congregation continue processing the grief and loss that have been felt in this last year, Session is offering a two-session Grief Workshop led by **the Rev. Dr. Martin Concepción**, a Presbyterian pastor and Bereavement Services Manager for VITAS Healthcare in Melbourne, to be held on **Tuesdays**, **July 1 & 8**, following a dinner at 6:00 p.m.

Workshop I — 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, July 1 (part of the First Tuesday Dinner) *Together in Grief, Together in Hope: A Faith-Centered Journey through Communal Loss* This compassionate, interactive workshop is designed to help faith communities navigate the collective grief of losing a pastor. Through theological reflection, psychological insight, and communal dialogue, participants will gain tools to honor their grief, understand the grieving process, and move toward healing while cherishing their pastor's legacy.

Workshop II — 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, July 8 (a dinner will be served) Finding Meaning and Hope: A Congregation's Journey through Grief

This workshop is designed to support our church community as we navigate the complex emotions of loss together. Through shared reflection, scripture, and open conversation, we aim to acknowledge our grief, explore how faith can bring purpose in the midst of sorrow, and inspire hope for the future. Our goal is to foster healing, strengthen our communal bonds, and encourage each member to find renewed meaning and peace on this journey.

WHAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

† On June 15, 1215, King John put his seal on the Magna Carta at Runnymede, which had been heavily influenced by Archbishop Stephen Langton, and established some basic rights for the people of England. On June 15, 1520, Pope Leo X issued his famous Exsurge Domine, which began "Arise, O Lord . . . a wild boar has invaded your vineyard." The wild boar was Martin Luther who was threatened with excommunication if he would not recant his beliefs. The document condemned Luther as a heretic on 41 counts and branded him an enemy of the Roman Catholic Church. Φ On June 15, 1551, **Theodore Beza** took sick while at Lausanne during the plague. His worried friend, John Calvin, wrote: "I am concerned about the loss the church would suffer if in the midst of his career he should suddenly be removed by death. I hope . . . that he will be given back to us in answer to our prayers." Calvin's prayers were answered. Beza had yet a half-century to minister. P Catholics in Massachusetts were finally granted religious freedom by the state constitution of June 15, 1780. * Samuel J. Mills was dedicated to foreign missions by his mother before his birth in 1783. He became a Christian at age 17, and was a participant in the famous 1806 "Haystack Prayer Meeting" that launched America's first foreign missionary program. He died at age 35 on this day in 1818 while returning from a missionary trip to Africa. • On June 15, 1951, missionary William C. Easton was leading a youth service in Columbia, South America. The police burst in and seized him and four young men. They were clubbed, whipped, dunked in cold water, stripped, and forced to roll in hot ashes. The next morning upon his release, Easton told the police, "I forgive you in the name of Jesus Christ."
