The term "voluntary" is used to denote a piece of music or improvisation for instrument, played before, during, or at the end of a church service.

The Season after Epiphany, also called **Ordinary Time**, means that which is standard, normative, usual, or typical. Since Ordinary Time is not a season, this period allows Sunday to be preeminent. Twice each year Ordinary Time is heightened by the extra-ordinary time of the Christmas and Easter cycles. They are extra-ordinary in that they intensify the foundational doctrines of incarnation and resurrection. This period ends on **Transfiguration of the Lord**, the Sunday before **Ash Wednesday**, the beginning of **Lent**. The color for Ordinary Time is GREEN, signifying spiritual growth (except on Communion Sundays when the color is white).



A six-week Pastor's Class began last week (meets **Mondays at 1:00 p.m. in Knox Hall**) to study together N.T. Wright's popular book, *Surprised by Hope: Rethinking Heaven, the Resurrection, and the Mission of the Church*. The class will last one hour. Wright's premise is that Christians normally think of the future in terms of "heaven," but the promised reality is far greater: a new heaven and a new earth, a whole new creation. He believes once we grasp this biblical vision of God's future, it will transform our understanding of life in the present. Each session begins with a video segment given by Wright himself, followed by a group discussion. The six sessions include: "Hope for the World," "The Hope of the Resurrection," "The Hope of Heaven," "The Hope of Jesus' Second Coming," "The Hope of Salvation," and "The Hope of the Church." *Look forward to seeing you in the class!*

WHAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

† After the outbreak of the Protestant Reformation in 1517, Roman Catholic officials convened the **Council of Trent** to articulate the principles of Catholicism. The first meeting took place in 1545, and met periodically for years as decisions were made and published. The third era of these periodic sessions convened on this day in 1562, with all hope of reconciliation with the Protestants gone. † On January 18, 1674, Scottish “**Worthy**” **James Mitchell** was executed after having been tortured for his faith. Being led to the Grassmarket in Edinburgh to be hanged, he was forbidden from preaching to the crowds, so he flung a manuscript of his message to the crowd. It said in part: “I am brought here that the work of God may be made manifest for the trial of faith, that I might be a witness for His despised truths and interests in this land, where I am called to seal the same with my blood... Farewell to all earthly enjoyments; and welcome Father, Son, and Holy Ghost into whose hands I commit my spirit.” † **Taylor University** was established in Fort Wayne, Indiana, by Methodists on January 18, 1846. † Today marks the birthday of **John Stam** (1907), who, along with his wife **Betty**, was murdered by the Communists in China in 1934. † **Andrew Murray**, Dutch Reformed pastor in South Africa and famous devotional writer, died on this day in 1917 at the age of 89. He spent most of his life in Christian social and educational ministries, and his books stress the deeper spiritual life and introduced the Keswick spirit into South Africa. † Irish Missionary **Amy Carmichael** died on January 18, 1951 at the age of 83. She served in India for 55 years and wrote 35 books about her work as a missionary.
